

Note:

Any changes or concerns regarding courses, absences, assignments, or projects must be addressed directly with the Academic Administration.

Credits Requirement

- To live on campus as a full-time student, you must be enrolled in at least **17 credit hours**.
- Single students and one parent in married couples with children must meet this requirement.
- The other parent in married couples with children is expected to take responsibility for the children.
- Married couples without children may both study full-time.

Changing Courses

- Course changes are permitted only during the **first week** after opening day.
- Approval is required from both the **Academic Director** and the **course teacher**.
- Once granted, changes must be reported to the office.

Attendance Policy

Students are expected to be punctual for all classes, devotions, prayer meetings, and practices, including music/voice lessons and choir practices.

Tardiness and Absences

- Late arrival: If a class has started when the student enters, they are considered late.
- Three "lates" equal one absence.
- Three absences result in a change of status from "credit" to "audit" in that class. The student must still attend the class and complete all work and tests.
- Planned absences must be pre-approved by the teacher, Academic Director, and house parents.
- Unapproved absences automatically change the student's status from "credit" to "audit," with the same requirement to complete coursework and tests.

School Materials

- Course materials will be provided during classes.
- Supplies like pens, pencils, and binders are available for purchase in the school office.
- Personal copies and printouts in black and white can be made for **two pesos per sheet** in the library.

Library

- The library is open **weekdays from 9:20 a.m. to 8:50 p.m.** (closed during mealtimes and on weekends). A schedule will be provided at the library door.
- **Reference books** may only be used in the library and must be returned to the librarian upon leaving.

- **Reserved books** may be borrowed for up to 3 hours and extended for another 3 hours if not requested by another student.
- Other books may be borrowed for two weeks with the option to extend upon librarian approval.
- Black and white photocopies can be made for **two pesos per sheet**. Homework copies are provided **free of charge**.

Library & Study Room Guidelines

- In the library, students should work quietly to avoid disturbing others.
- In the study room, conversations are allowed but must remain orderly.
- Keep the study area tidy before leaving.
- Food and drinks are not allowed in the library. Handle books with care, ensuring they remain clean and are not used during meals.

Computer & Internet Access

- The school provides six computers connected to the internet. One computer is reserved exclusively for printing.
- Students may use the internet for research purposes. Research activities take priority over personal use.
- Students may connect their devices to the school's open network. However, **social media** and **streaming platforms** are restricted and supervised accordingly.
- Kids whose parents are studying are not allowed to use the computers.

Graduation Requirements

To graduate, students must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Christian Commitment
 - Be a committed Christian with a good testimony among fellow students and friends, demonstrating this throughout your time at Steinreich Bibelschule (Rom. 10:9–10; 12:1–2; Eph. 2:8–10).
 - Your **character and attitude** will be assessed as part of your eligibility for graduation.
- 2. Credit Hours
 - Complete **70 credits** and all required courses:
 - Old Testament I & II
 - New Testament I & II
 - Introduction to the Bible
 - Personal Evangelism
 - Life of Christ
 - Acts
 - Forgiveness
 - Church History
 - Mennonite History
 - Mission
 - Theology I & II
 - Spiritual Life
 - New Testament Book
 - Old Testament Book
 - Competent Writing
 - Hermeneutics
- 3. Exit Interviews
 - Participate in **two exit interviews**, one with the Director and the other with a teacher.
- 4. Devotion Presentation
 - Present an **evening devotion** (not just a personal testimony) during your final year of study.
